- * 1974 Vincenzo Guzzo takes this theatre over as his first theatre in what is now Le Cinémas Guzzo. It was booked by France-Film. The theatre is renamed Paradis.
- * 1977 split into 3 cinemas

Messina GSS sensory seats installed December 6, 2002 in the biggest cinema of this theatre. They were removed in 2004

AKA: Le Mirage, Cinéma 2,18 \$, Cinéma St. Leonard
9480 Lacordaire
* 1980 opened as Astre 4 by Le Cinémas Guzzo and booked by France-Film
* Late 1980's-Early 1990 switched to mostly English language movies
* 1994 Closed by Guzzo in favour of the Lacordaire Cinema. Later in the year, it reopened as Le Mirage 4 by Ciné-Enterprise and booked by Famous Players
* 1996 closed when the Lacordaire cinemas expanded
* 1997 reopened as Cinéma St. Leonard 2, 18 \$ on a French Language policy by Dominic Piccolo
* 2007 opens weekends only
* Late 2008 closed

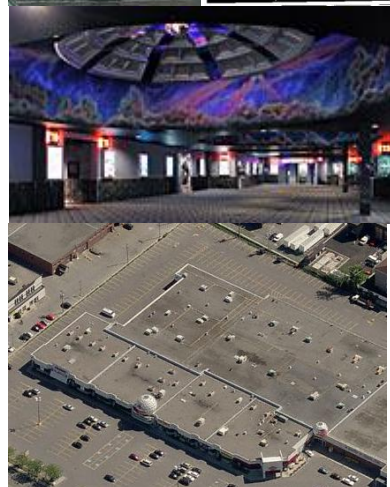
